Where as Captain Barclay undertook the challenge for a 1000 Guineas bet, Richard completed the challenge to raise money for four charities - Racing Welfare, the Alzheimer's Society, Sparks and Spinal Research. Bookmaker Paddy Power recreated the bet and will donate the sum of $\pounds10,000$ to the Charity Trust.

Richard said: "I undertook this challenge to raise as much money as I could for the charities but I had absolutely no idea that I would receive this level of support. There are so many people that I need to thank - **the team who have looked after me*, the Bedford Lodge Hotel who have housed and fed me, and our partners, in particular Godolphin, Darley, Barclays, Paddy Power, Nike and the Jockey Club. It is an experience I shall never forget, although I'm looking forward to getting a little bit of sleep now!"

*Club members Amos Seddon, Jon May and Ron Wallwork, RWA President Glyn Jones, Belgravian Eric Hall and Leicester RH's Mal Blyth, were the team that Richard referred to and they were ably assisted by a host of walkers who travelled to join them when they could. Travel Advice

London Inter Club Challenge (& Enfield League) 5,000 Metres Walk.

This event is scheduled for Saturday 25th July at Parliament Hill Fields Track (11.45am). Parliament Hill Fields Track is next to Gospel Oak railway station, which is why so many attenders use it. Gospel Oak station is served by 2 lines : the North London Line and the Barking-to-Gospel Oak line. Both lines have upgrading work (in preparation for the London 2012 Olympics) over that weekend. For details of this, and of replacement bus services, log onto www.tfl.gov.uk/overground and then click onto "Closures" where all is revealed. Bus C11 (every 9 minutes) takes just 5 minutes from Archway Underground Station (Northern Line) and drops you right outside Parliament Hill Field gates.

Parking tip : The adjacent Lido car park is for their users only. Get spotted parking in the Lido car park and then seen walking to the athletics track will almost certainly get you a parking ticket. Be careful in the roads around Parliament Hill Fields. There is street parking, but please look at notices to ensure that you can park without penalty. Hope this helps. Dave A.
