XXXV Gran Premio Cantones Da A Coruna De Marcha (WA Race Walking Tour – Gold), La Coruna, Spain (Sat. 28th May)

This was the thirty-fifth staging of the **Gran Premio Cantones Da A Coruna De Marcha** attracting high class fields for the two 20k races, which were won by China's Shijie Qieyang and Spain's Alvaro Martin.

The women's race started off cautiously, probably due to the warm temperature of 28°c. A leading pack of six soon developed formed of Qieyang, Jemima Montag (AUS), Kimberley Garcia (PER), Sandra Arenas (COL) and Spanish duo of Maria Perez and Laura Garcia-Caro.

The first 5km was covered in 22:20, after which Qieyang pushed the pace and only had Garcia for company. A further injection of pace saw Qieyang drop Garcia as she reached 10km in 43:44 eight seconds ahead of the Peruvian and went onto take the win in 1:27:50, 48 seconds ahead of Garcia who was almost a minute ahead of Perez in third

Heather Lewis took a very creditable 13th place in 1:36:54.

The men's race was held in much more favourable conditions, with a large group of twenty plus walkers forming at the front of the field. The 5km was reached in 20:16 and 10km in 40:46. At this point Alvaro Martin and Diego Garcia moved to the head of the pack to walk alongside Brazilian Caio Bonfim. Just before the hour mark Garcia took the lead, but Bonfim returned to the lead going through 15km in 1:00:39. Martin led through the bell with Garcia tucked in behind him. With 700m remaining Martin pulled out a small gap which he retained until the finish, clocking 1:19:58, just two seconds ahead of Garcia with Bonfim a further 14 seconds behind in third.

Callum Wilkinson, just 12 weeks after knee surgery, only intended to complete 10km, recording a Commonwealth Games qualifying time of

41:22. Younger brother George, making his debut over 20km recorded a time of 1:39:19.

British Masters 10,000m Track Championships, Horspath Stadium, Oxford (Sun. 8th May)

The British Masters 10000m Track Championship was held at Horspath Road, Oxford, *reports Andrew Clough*. It was part of the annual BMAF Combined Events and 10,000m Championships. Twelve athletes assembled on a slightly overcast morning with a slight breeze... seemingly perfect for the event. Unfortunately, the clouds and breeze disappeared part way through to make things quite uncomfortable, which took its toll on some competitors.

David Annetts sped away from the start, earning three quick warnings for loss of contact and two red cards with the race not even half way through. Nevertheless, he satisfied the other two judges and came home in a new M55 record of 48:39.85. Behind him Grazia Manzotti and Melanie Peddle were in an excellent tussle for the W50 title. Melanie tried to pass on several occasions but had to ease up a little when a red card appeared. Grazia finally pulled away off the final bend to be greeted by a yellow contact paddle which gave Melanie hope of catching her on the line. Both finished within the existing W50 record, Grazia jubilant in 56:39.30, and Melanie about six seconds behind.

Trevor Jones took the M65 title finishing within the hour ahead of Ian Torode , who kept good form for a personal best. In the M60 category both athletes drew attention from the judges and found themselves on the posting board. David Walsh kept going steadily whilst his rival Steve Uttley was not his usual fluent self. Steve had to stop for a short time to take on water but stayed on the course and came in five minutes behind Walsh. In between them Martin Slevin was runner up in the M55 group after a clean performance which he hopes to maintain when returning to the adverse cambers of Midland road courses.

Paul Hawkins, returning to the fray after a long enforced lay off started really well, settling in at the back of the field. He quickly accumulated warnings, then red cards as his knees suffered in the increased temperature. The third card eventually appeared half way through the race and the inevitable followed. Ian Richards also started well, in a

group behind his Steyning team mate Trevor. As the weather changed lan's forward lean increased and he dropped back. Each judge issued a warning for 'knees' and after forty minutes the third card arrived.

The closest competition of the day was in the W70 group where record holder Noel Blatchford and EMAC's Susan Barnett were always within a couple of metres of each other. Susan quickly earned a card and settled in behind Noel all the way to the home straight when she tried to get past. With two judges watching closely both racers somehow kept their form Noel claiming the title by 0.07s ... around 15cm after ten kilometres!

Dave Compton Memorial 7 Mile, Chorley (Sat. 7th May)

A larger than expected field turned out at today's race in memory of one of the club's most stylish walkers and to complement this show of affection for a friend lost the weather was very kind, *reports Dave Evans*.

Unlike other club events, it was decided to start everyone at the same time which produced some interesting results with quite a few aspirants having a chance to "medal". The opening mile saw Adrian Edwards in full command ticking through in 10 mins 22 seconds having negotiated the real roller coaster of the opening section of the course. In his wake were Ian Hilditch with an astonishing 10 mins 52 and Sailash Shah in 11 mins 22. The main pack were not too far behind the leading three with all bar one dipping under 12 mins 23.

Being an out and back course meant some leg sapping ascents but equally leg testing descents. Most club walkers are hardy souls and rise to the challenge of big ups and downs. At the three and a half mile point Eric Horwill reminded them of their midway times and it was clear that some of the more genteel starters were beginning to close on their adversaries. Quite a few were destined to record negative splits. Adrian reached halfway in 38 mins 50 seconds and both Eric and I had to rub our eyes when Ian Hilditch came into view only 73 seconds adrift. Glyn Jones was sticking to his task particularly well and seems to be recovering from his recent back problems. In practice, this is not a course to help such a condition but nevertheless, he raced on. Hot on the heels of Glyn was a trio of "youngsters" but as the final results showed they lost time on the homeward stage.

The final 1 mile of the race involves two long climbs, and one steep descent and officials are sometimes very surprised when the walkers come into the finish in a different order than that predicted. On this occasion Steven Wilde, a newcomer to the club produced a strong final couple of miles and took 4th place. Pat Evans, now thankfully recovering from a leg problem, completed the 7 with no adverse effects. Andrea Lennon is a remarkable lady and at 80 years of age is able to handle this very hill course with maturity. She always looks very composed and has a ready smile at the finish. Andrea clocked an impressive 104 mins 12. The winner of the handicap was our club secretary Roy Gunnett who squeezed home by 18 seconds from Steve Wilde. Dave Crompton's partner Louise completed the course with Emma, Dave's daughter, in a very respectable 111 mins 37 seconds, pretty good going on one of the country's hilliest courses.
