## SELECTION POLICIES PUBLISHED FOR THE 2023 EUROPEAN UNDER 23 CHAMPIONSHIPS IN ESPOO (FIN)

British Athletics have announced details of the selection policy for the European Under 23 Championships in Espoo, Finland to be held between 13th to 16th July 2023.

The qualification standards are:

Men	Event	Women
1:29:00	20km Walk	1:43:00

- Race Walk performances achieved in road events must be achieved on World Athletics certified courses,
- There will be no specific trial for the U23 20km walks,
- Athletes will be expected to show form/fitness over the 10,000m race-walk at the U23 T & F championships,
- Team will be selected on 19<sup>th</sup> June 2023.



# Race Walks removed from UKA Championships - Update

Following the announcement that the race walks were to be removed from the British indoor and outdoor championships representations were made to the UK Athletics Major Events and International Relations lead Cherry Alexander OBE by Glyn Jones (RWA Chair) on behalf of the RWA and Andi Drake who sits British Athletics Endurance Advisory Panel headed by Jackie Newton and Chris Jones, and as part of this has been asked to lead on strategy for Marathon and Race Walks.

Reproduced below is the email response from Cherry to Glyn: Hi Glyn

Thanks for getting in touch, not sure why TV has ended up leading this conversation or discussion externally but the main reason ALL programmes are being looked at is to do with the length of timetables and the duration of the officials officiating.

Not sure if you are aware, but UKA has received lots of negative feedback about the length of days for both the indoor and outdoor championships hence how this discussion began. TV did not stimulate the discussion however of course; it is a key part.

I know the Events group are looking at the various options. Already there are a number of disciplines not within the track and field programme, Night of the 10ks, Combined Events will be covered the World Indoor Tour weekend to help alleviate the duration of the timetables and due to UKA finances take the days back to two rather than three so indeed there is a lot to be thought through.

I believe the 5k Race Walks will be included within the World Athletics Tour event in June and of course any inclusion of a Championship events will include the awarding of the Medal plus the appropriate World Ranking points afforded to Nat Champ events.

You may not be aware, but I am one of the strong advocates of RW in my European role and a believer that RW should receive the highest promotion and relevant creative content that all disciplines deserve. For me it is never about under valuing a discipline but showcasing it thoroughly with content driven promotion and results thereafter. With the 5ks included in the Tour even for instance, this will certainly be the case.

I am in the office tomorrow so would appreciate a further exchange with you if your available. Please give me a call if you can, my number is 07803 671 981. We can talk through all the options to get to the best possible place to elevate and promote the Walks. I have also exchanged emails with Tom.

# **Overseas**

Irish 20km & 35km Championships, British 35km Championships, Irish Masters 10km Championships plus supporting Age Group Races (World Athletics Race Walking Tour Event - Bronze), Dublin, Ireland (Sun. 18<sup>th</sup> Dec.)



More than 100 race walkers descended on St. Anne's Park, Raheny, Dublin for the World Athletics Race Walking Tour Event which doubled as the Irish National Championships and the British 35km National Championships.

The races drew plenty of attention ahead of the World Championships, which will take place in Budapest 2023. With the new qualification system having been introduced over recent years, athletes must either secure a qualification time or accumulate points from various world tour events and secure sufficient points to rank them in the top fifty.

The fields included ten British race walkers. Callum Wilkinson made his debut over 35km claiming fourth place overall in 2:43.42 and won the British 35km title.

In the 20km, a great walk by Chris Snook who reduced his personal best from 1:33:54 to 1:27:56 for the second fastest time by a Brit in 2022 and moved to 28<sup>th</sup> on the all-time list. There were new personal bests for Luc Legon of 1:34:52 *(previous 1:37:01)* and Abigail Jennings with 1:46:19 *(previous 1:49:29)* to move to 25<sup>th</sup> on the all-time list. Solid debuts for Matthew Crane (1:38:30) and Emily Ghose (2:00:10).

Three British juniors contested the 10km. Christian and Hannah Hopper have both had injury problems so were a little below their best. Hannah finished in  $2^{nd}$  place in the junior women's race with 54:06 and younger brother Christian  $3^{rd}$  junior man with 52:28.

Jonathan Ellerton made his debut over 10km with a 57:40 clocking.

# Domestic 'B' Races

## Brighton & Hove AC Boxing Day Races, Preston Park (Mon. 26<sup>th</sup> Dec.)

On a crisp and sunny Monday morning, the revived Boxing Day road races in Preston Park attracted nearly one hundred athletes and fundraised £330 for the Clock Tower Sanctuary in Brighton.

This was not a bad result, as confirmation that the races would go ahead for the first time in three years came just a few weeks before Christmas. This was after the "Lockdown" break, and it will take a few years for the numbers to build up to the usual two hundred competitors.

Originally, in 1932, the races were confined to race walkers, and it was not until 1952 that runners were involved.

The walkers' 5-mile race was first off, and it produced a fine three-way battle for the 4-lap race with penalties, an occupation for race walkers, actually deciding the final positions.



Sixty-five-year-old Trevor Jones from Steyning, who has recently returned to racing after a long period of injury, proved the winner by escaping penalties in 52:56. Birchfield Harriers Ian Torode, was second clocking 53:06, after losing 30 seconds and David Kemp was also deducted half a minute came third in 53:24.

Former British women's 10,000m record holder Julie Drake returned to race walking but only completed three of the four laps. She is now in her fifties, and race walking is a pretty tough discipline that needs constant training. However, she has lost little of her technique and style.

Unfortunately, a heavy cold and chest infection prevented Ron Penfold from Steyning, who had made approx. fifty appearances, from participating in the race this year.
